

- Make sure we have your email address and correct phone number!




# Tip #1 Make MyStudent Your Best Friend!





## Tip #8 Support your Student in Practicing These 5 Life Skills

- Nutrition- eating breakfast, drinking water, and eating healthy foods
- Rest- 8-9 hours of sleep a night help your child recharge, renew, and relax
- Fun- read, listen to music, play, create, hangout, and explore.
- Exercise- walk, run, dance, pedal, move it for 30 minutes or more a day.
- Social Support- Hanging out with people you like and who like you too. Having family and friends you can count on.



- Clothing that is offensive may not be worn.
- All shorts and skirts must be no shorter than 6 inches above the knee.
- Pants will be worn securely. Students are allowed one inch of midrift on their shirts.
- Shirts and tops must "cup" over the shoulder for both boys and girls.
- Hats are not permitted on campus

## CAR LOOP PROCEDURES

#### **Student Procedures**

- Students will be called by their classroom/floor number daily
- When they leave their classroom they are to go directly to the gym and wait for their name to be called over the microphone
- Students are not permitted to wait on the sidewalk for their parents
- Students are not permitted to cross the parking lot to get to their parents car.

#### **Student Drop- Off**

- Students can be dropped off in the car loop in the morning 20 minutes before school begins
- Please keep the line moving to ensure no students are late for class, please pull all the way up to the front of the line before your child leaves the vehicle

#### **Student Pick-Up**

- Afternoon pick-up will have two lines running at the same time in the car loop
- Parents must have their child's name on their dashboard for the caller in the carline
- Student names are called from the caller and then they will come to your vehicle
- Students are not permitted to cross the parking lot for safety reasons.

## BUS LOOP PROCEDURES

- Students will be called by classroom/floor number to go to the buses in the afternoon
- When students arrive to the bus loop, they can look for their bus or ask an adult with a bus roster for the location of their bus. Buses are set-up in two lines, so students need to look carefully if they do not ask an adult
- Students are not allowed to use the crosswalk at the bus loop because it a safety concern for students to walk in front of the school buses
- Students have roughly 10 minutes (after the first week of school) to be on their bus before they are dismissed.
- If students miss their bus, a parent will be required to come and pick them up prior to 4:30pm

#### **LOCKERS**

- Lockers will be \$5 each
- Market They will be available for purchase during the first week of school
- We have lockers in both the hallways and the locker rooms
