Ensembles

Beginning Band/Band 1: This year-long band is intended for students with little to no musical experience. This class will focus on mastering the fundamentals of each instrument and the basic technique and ensemble skills. The Beginning Band will perform at 2 concerts during the school year. Students will be assigned an instrument that best fits the students' ability.

Advanced Band/Band 2 and 3: This band is open to students at an intermediate or advanced level of development. This group consists of mostly seventh and eighth grade students who have successfully completed the Beginning Band class. This ensemble will help students to build upon the fundamentals learned in Beginning Band, and increase individual technique and musicianship. The Symphonic Band will perform at all concerts and football games during the year and will participate in Music Performance Assessment.

Beginning Orchestra/Orchestra 1: This year-long orchestra is intended for students with little to no musical experience. This class will focus on mastering the fundamentals of each instrument and the basic technique and ensemble skills. The Beginning Orchestra will perform at 2 concerts during the school year. Students will be assigned an instrument that best fits the students' ability.

Advanced Orchestra/Orchestra 2 and 3: This orchestra is open to students at an intermediate or advanced level of development. This group consists of mostly seventh and eighth grade students who have successfully completed the Beginning Orchestra class. This ensemble will help students to build upon the fundamentals learned in Beginning Orchestra, and increase individual technique and musicianship. The Advanced Orchestra will perform at all concerts during the year and will participate in Music Performance Assessment.

Supplies

All students will need the following supplies for class everyday. Please communicate with me immediately if there are any issues finding or purchasing these items.

Instrument Rental

Students who play the **Flute**, **Oboe**, **Clarinet**, **Alto Saxophone**, **Trombone**, **Percussion**, **Trumpet**, **and Cello** are encouraged to rent their own instruments from an outside source. French Horn, Tuba, Bassoon, Bass Clarinet, Bari Saxophone, Euphonium, and Bass players may rent from a provider or borrow their instrument from CCMS. Students who play the **Violin and Viola** are required to rent an instrument from an outside source. We have limited instruments available for student usage. Please contact Mr. Perrault if you cannot rent. Students borrowing school instruments are responsible for repairs to the instruments and any damages incurred while the instrument is checked out to the student. Instrument check out will be during the first week(s) of school. Donations towards the maintenance of these instruments are encouraged and welcomed.

Recommended Instrument and Mouthpiece Brands

When renting or purchasing instruments pay close attention to instrument and/or mouthpiece brands. These brands will help the students to achieve a quality sound.

- Flute: Yamaha, Pearl, Jupiter, Gemeinhardt.
- Oboe: Yamaha, Fox, Selmer. Wood model recommended. 3 medium soft reeds: http://www.oboe.net
- **Bassoon**: Three medium soft reeds: http://www.clarkreeds.com
- Clarinet: Size 2.5-3 (3.5 for advanced) Vandoren reeds. Yamaha, Buffet, Leblanc, Selmer. Wood model recommended. Yamaha CL4C mouthpiece recommended.
- Alto Saxophone: Size 2.5-3 (3.5 for advanced) Vandoren reeds. Yamaha, Selmer. C* mouthpiece recommended. Recommended Mouthpiece: Yamaha YACAS4C
- **Tenor Saxophone**: Size 2.5-3 (3.5 for advanced) Vandoren reeds. Yamaha, Selmer. Recommended Mouthpiece: Yamaha YAC TS5C
- **Baritone Saxophone:** Size 3 (3.5 for advanced) Vandoren reeds. Recommended Mouthpiece: Yamaha YAC BS5C
- Trumpet: Yamaha, Bach, Jupiter, Holton, Getzen. Size 3c mouthpiece.
- French Horn: Yamaha, Conn, Holton. Yamaha 32C4 mouthpiece
- Trombone: Yamaha, Bach, Holton, Conn. Bach, Bach mouthpiece size 6 ½
- Euphonium: Bach 6½ AL or Kelly 6½ AL mouthpiece.

- Tuba: Bach 18 or Kellyburg mouthpiece.
- Percussion: Basic Stick Bag
- Violin: Mendini, Yamaha, Amadeus
- Viola: Mendini, Yamaha, Amadeus
- Cello: Mendini, Stentor, Cremona

A student's final academic grade is determined using the following school-wide grading scale.

Band and orchestra grades will be based on the following criteria:

Weekly Preparation & Daily display of "efficient rehearsal strategies" MU.68.S.3.6

The daily grade will be based on instrument preparation, being seated and playing in a timely manner (within 3 minutes), and having the required items for class (instrument, music, pencil) at your seat. If we are having a class discussion or doing an activity, it is expected that all students actively participate.

Music Binder

Music Binders are needed everyday and will serve as the student's music folder for performances so they must be kept in good condition. Students must use sheet protectors for their music. ANYTHING handed out in class whether it is music, worksheets, extra resources, etc... are expected to be kept in the music binder for reference. Binder checks will happen regularly though the quarter and students will be given multiple days notice prior to a binder check.

Performances

All performances throughout the year are REQUIRED for all students, and count as a grade. If the absence is excused a make-up assignment will be given. No make-up assignments will be provided for students who had unexcused absence from a performance. Students who miss a significant portion of rehearsals will be unable to perform with our band at the directors discretion.

Rehearsal/Playing/Written Tests

Playing Tests will be given regularly throughout the quarter. Students may choose their playing tests from the list distributed at the start of the year. Students may not repeat a playing test that has already been completed. The teacher will grade on note accuracy, sound, and effort.

Written tests will be given via paper and pencil or virtually through canvas. These tests help to reinforce note-reading ability and understanding of musical terminology and concepts.

<u>Late Work:</u> Late work will be accepted until the end of each quarter.

District finals are required for all band courses, and principal approved exams for orchestra classes.

Classwork (Binders and weekly preparation) account for 30% of the grade, and assessments (Tests and performances) account for 70%.

ESEP:Board Policy for academic dishonesty: Students at all levels are expected to pursue their studies with integrity and honesty in all school settings. All work that a student submits will be the original and authentic work of the individual students unless otherwise specified by the assignment.

All grades will be posted in Mystudent. I encourage all students to check their grades weekly on Mystudent.

Playing Assessment Rubric

For the student to successfully pass-off a selection they must perform within the shaded areas. Students that do not reach this the first time may retry as many times as they would like before or after school, or during make up days. Make ups must be completed in the same marking quarter.

Music Fair Share

Each student is required to pay an annual fee of \$25.00. This yearly payment is vital to run a successful band program and will contribute towards the following:

- Upkeep and maintenance for all school owned instruments/equipment.
- Regularly purchasing new sticks, mallets, instruments, and equipment.
- Transportation for all off campus performances/activities.
- Regularly purchasing new music for performances.

The music fair share should be paid as soon as possible. Please try to pay your fair share during the first weeks of the school year.

After School Rehearsals

The director will at some point call for extra after school rehearsals. The director will give at least two weeks notice of rehearsals. All rehearsals will be scheduled with the master calendar of the school to make sure that rehearsal is scheduled at a convenient time, and conflicts as little as possible with other after school activities.

It is the responsibility of the student to find transportation home from after school rehearsals. After school rehearsals are mandatory when scheduled, and critical if called. All students must attend. These rehearsals will be counted as a performance grade.

Fundraisers

Fundraising is a critical part of keeping any music program running. All students should participate in fundraisers not only to raise money for the program, but also to help buy instruments and music for future students to come. There will be fundraising opportunities for students throughout the year to help defray trip and program costs.

Trips

Representing the Cypress Creek Middle School Music Program is an honor and a privilege to be taken very seriously. Parents and students alike will be expected to act accordingly with all School District of Pasco County Policies, Cypress Creek Middle School Policies, the policies set forth in this handbook, and any special instructions or expectations given by the director, school personnel, or chaperones. Failure to abide by the set policies at any point can and will result in a student's loss of privileges for future trips and any necessary disciplinary action. Parents of students with extensive medical conditions may be asked to accompany their student on a trip. Please inform the director with any special accommodations for students as soon as possible so that arrangements can be made.

Trips will be taken throughout the year. They will be for the purpose of music performance, education, or possibly incentive. A student must complete the Pasco County School Field Trip Form and turn it in at least two days prior to leaving on a trip. Students must also meet the academic requirements for their classes to be able to participate in these field trips.

Additionally, parents are a huge part of any trip. Without chaperones, we are not able to make any trip possible. CCMS encourages our parents and supporters to become Pasco County approved volunteers and chaperone our trips.

Availability

Please email me with questions at any time. My office phone can be reached after school M-F from 2:40-3:10. I will use myStudent messaging as my primary means of communication.

I offer academic lunch every day during 7^{th} and 8^{th} grade lunch. Students must get a pass prior to going to the cafeteria.

Concert Attire

All ensembles – Concert Blacks. Black dress shirt (long sleeve), dress pants, black shoes (no tennis shoes). Girls may wear dresses which go below the knee.

Advanced Band (football games) – This year's CCMS band shirt (to be purchased by students through Rycor) and black shorts.

Concert blacks are **MANDATORY** at **ALL** performances. Students **not** in uniform may not be allowed to perform, and their grade will be adjusted accordingly.

*** Jeans will **not** be an acceptable alternative to dress pants. Please try to find these items before concert week! Please let Mr. Perrault know if you are having issues finding these items.

Lockers

All students in the CCMS band program have the opportunity to use a band room instrument locker. If a student chooses to use a CCMS band locker they must understand it is for the purpose of <u>their</u> instrument and music only. They are not to keep food or drinks of any kind in their lockers. Due to limited space, some students may have to share lockers. The Director, CCMS and Pasco County are not responsible for any items that are lost and/or stolen from these lockers. These lockers are subject to search at any time by the director/CCMS Staff/Pasco County.

Tardy Policy

It is the expectation of Mr. Perrault and CCMS that students are in the classroom when the tardy bell rings. Students not in the room when the bell rings will be marked tardy. Repeated tardies will result in disciplinary action.

Classroom Rules

- 1. Always be silent when the director is talking or when the ensemble is rehearsing.
- 2. The $\underline{\textbf{B}}$ and/orchestra room should be left cleaner than you found it.
- 3. The <u>Classroom</u> and your peers should always be treated with respect. Do not touch what is not yours.
- 4. **D**ismissal is done by the director not the bell or other students in the hall.
- 5. Everyone should play at the instructed spot, when instructed to do so.
- 6. $\underline{\mathbf{F}}$ ood, gum, and drinks other than water need to be left in your backpacks.
- 7. A **G**reat sound will be achieved by a well-prepared class with active participation by every student!

If any of these rules are broken, the chain of disciplinary action is as follows*:

- 1. Redirection
- 2. Parent phone call/email
- 3. Parent phone call/email discussing the behavior & lunch detention
- 4. Written office referral

^{*}Severe discipline issues may result in removal from the music program.

Private Lessons

Private lessons are not required but they are strongly encouraged. As music classes are rather large, covering technique with every individual student every day is not possible. Private instructors can easily assess many issues in the one-on-one setting to develop important skills and techniques. If you would like to enroll your child in private lessons, there are many outlets to choose from. Many local music stores offer lessons. Also, the University of South Florida is home to many professors and students who teach privately. Please speak to Mr. Perrault for more information.
